FOR SUPPRESSION OF FRUIT FLY ON POME AND STONE FRUIT

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. Note 1. Victoria is not included in this permit, as their *Control-of-Use* legislation means a permit is not required to legalise this off-label use in that state.

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply thorough foliar cover spray after stone set in stone fruit or from about 5.5 cm in diameter for apples, depending on the pest pressure as determined by regular orchard scouting and fruit fly trapping.
- Use a non-ionic wetting agent such as Agral at a rate of 10 mL/100 L.
- For ground use only in airblast sprayer or equivalent.
- DO NOT apply more than four (4) applications per season, with a minimum of 14 days between consecutive sprays.
- Follow all label restraints including spray drift restraints.
- Spinetoram must be used in conjunction with other control strategies to be effective in reducing fruit fly damage to below economic thresholds.
- DO NOT apply when conditions are unsuitable for water based spray conditions, i.e. high temperatures, strong winds, inversion conditions or imminent rain.

Withholding Periods:

Stone fruit: DO NOT harvest for 3 DAYS after final application.

Pome fruit: DO NOT harvest for 7 DAYS after final application.

Additional Conditions:

This PERMIT provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

PERSONS who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

Export of Produce

Exported produce or animals must have appropriate residue tolerance limits established in the importing countries and any residues must not exceed the tolerance limits.
