



PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT

FOR THE CONTROL OF MITE PESTS IN BLACKBERRIES

Product to be used:

APPARENT SULFURE 800 WG FUNGICIDE AND MITICIDE (APVMA No. 55264)
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 800 g/kg SULPHUR PRESENT AS WETTABLE SULPHUR as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

RESTRAINTS

- DO NOT apply within 3 weeks of an oil spray or mix with oils or formulation containing mineral oil
- DO NOT apply in hot weather

Blackberries	Broad mite (<i>Polyphagotarsonemus latus</i>) Two-Spotted Mite (<i>Tetranychus urticae</i>) Bean Spider Mite (<i>Tetranychus ludeni</i>) Red Berry Mite (<i>Acalitus essigi</i>)	400-500 g/100L

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply as a foliar spray in a spray volume of 1000 L/ha using airblast sprayer or equivalent. Complete coverage of all foliage is essential.
- Application is to be made on new growing canes during the vegetative growth stage
- DO NOT make more than ten applications per crop with a minimum retreatment interval of 7-14 days between consecutive applications.
- Avoid spray contact with flowers
- Follow all label recommendations and restraints.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

All States and Territories

Additional Conditions:

This permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit.

Export of treated produce:

Treated crop commodities destined for export may require extra time being allowed between application and harvest, to be accepted in some export markets. If treated produce is to be exported, due account should be taken of the residue definition and residue limits/import tolerances of importing countries; any residues must not exceed those requirements of the importing country.

To avoid crop damage:

The sensitivity of some species and varieties of the crops to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable, therefore, to only treat a small number of plants to ascertain their reaction before treating the whole crop.
