# Prune Fund Annual Investment Plan 2023/24



## Proposed investments in 2023/24

A list of proposed R&D investments in the Prune Fund in 2023/24 can be found below. Each year, prune industry representatives meet as advisory panels to discuss investment recommendations in line with the prune Strategic Investment Plan (SIP). At these meetings, the panels are provided with a financial forecast and an investment analysis of current investments. Based on this information, they provide Hort Innovation with advice on priorities for investment for the upcoming year.

The prune R&D advisory panel met on February 9, 2023, to discuss, provide advice on, and prioritise recommendations on investments in 2023/24. The R&D investment recommendations are listed in order of priority in Table 1.

Note: Investments will be aligned to form multi-industry projects where possible, and all investments are subject to funding availability. If investments do not occur in this financial year, they will be reconsidered and reprioritised for the prune Annual Investment Plan (AIP) 2024/25.
