Overview

Hort Innovation convened a meeting of the olive Strategic Investment Advisory Panel (SIAP) on February 16, 2017.

The primary purpose of the meeting was for the panel to review the new Strategic Investment Plan (SIP) and other meeting inputs in order to provide advice to Hort Innovation on the next tier of priorities for investment.

The panel received of updates on:

- Hort Innovation operations, including recent changes to the Hort Innovation board and voting arrangements for growers as well as Hort Innovation's evolving communications outputs
- 2. The outcomes and progress of a number of multi-industry investments by Hort Innovation, including:

A financial summary of the Hort Innovation olive fund was provided, including a mid-range investment forecast and an overview of current and historical investment.

The panel was asked to provide advice on investment priorities in relation to two key aspects of olive oil quality and received a presentation from a service provider in the course of the discussion.

The panel participated in a workshop to identify and prioritise the next tier of priorities for R&D investment. The key priorities were then discussed in further detail in order to add further context to the scope of the investment.

In coming weeks Hort Innovation will move to invest in the key areas identified by the panel.

Next steps

Hort Innovation is currently working to progress specific investments addressing grower best practices in production, industry communications, biosecurity, risk management and olive oil quality.
