



**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF A REGISTERED AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT
FOR PRE-HARVEST TREATMENT FOR FRUIT FLY ON CHERRIES**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. Products to be used:

DIPTEREX 500 SL INSECTICIDE (APVMA No. 33102)

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 500 g/L TRICHLORFON (an anticholinesterase compound) as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop Type	Insect Pest	Application Rate
CHERRIES (Pre- harvest treatment)	Queensland Fruit Fly (<i>Bactrocera tryoni</i>) Mediterranean Fruit Fly (<i>Ceratitis capita</i>)	250 mL product / 100 L

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply spray pre-harvest within two (2) weeks of harvest.
- Refer to approved product label use pattern and general instructions to control Queensland Fruit Fly in stone fruit crops.

Withholding Period:

DO NOT harvest for 2 DAYS after application.

Jurisdiction:

SA only.

Additional Conditions:

This permit allows for the use of a product in a manner specified on the permit. Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the details and conditions of this permit. Unless otherwise stated, the use of the product must be in accordance with the product label.

Export of treated produce

MRLs can be found in the *Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code (MRL Standard)*

Instrument 2019. MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, residues must not exceed the limits/tolerances of the importing country.
